On September 18th, Jim Berry, a contractor for Longview Cable, will be putting cable lines in. Beginning at 108 Waldron Ferry Rd, heading east on the south side of Waldron Ferry for approximately 200 feet, then turning north on the west side of Laurel Lane for approximately 200 feet ending at 516 Laurel Lane.

Concerning our water, a bacteriology sample test was taken to Northeast Texas Public Health District Regional Lab in Tyler. All lab results were Negative no Total coliform or Escherichia coli was found in our water.

A story about a dog named Dingo.


