A couple weeks ago, when we had that heavy rain, we had a major roof leak. What a mess! It was in our back storage vault and of course it was full. The employees got right on it. It took a couple of days of sorting, drying and tossing but most everything was salvaged. Thanks to H & C Sheet Metal, D&S Construction, All-Seasons A/C for getting out to take care of us so quickly. The vault is all repaired, loaded and organized. The next step is to figure out how to construct a new roof over the building. D&S is working on that so hopefully we will have that taken care of soon.

There are lots of things going on in our community. New businesses moving in and new home construction continues. I am amazed at how much our City has changed in the last few years. I am still looking for volunteers to serve on a future growth/goal setting committee. I have 4-5 names and I will start calling on a few of you soon. We need to get this started in January and I would like to have 20 or folks on the committee. Please email me and let me know if you would consider serving, some of your background and experience, etc.

The holiday season is upon us. I want to encourage everyone to **Dine in and Shop in Hallsville**! We have almost everything you could need right here in our City. Stop and check our restaurants and retail businesses.

Our annual Christmas parade is set for December 10 at 6:30 p.m. One thing that will be different this year will be the lack of Christmas decorations on the electric poles along Highway 80 and FM 450. I've been in office for a little over 4 years and have gotten constant complaints about the old, ugly decorations that we put up each year. O.k. I hear you! They were bought used 30-40 years ago and have been repaired a gazillion times and they are still old and ugly. I am giving up and giving in and they are not going to be put up this year. I think the last straw was when they were taken down last year, most of the bulbs got broken and it costs several hundred dollars to replace them. Plus the ornaments that didn't light up were due to problems with the connections on the poles. After investigating and talking to AEP, we do not own those poles. They are all on State property and belong to AEP. They have allowed us to continue to use them 'as is'.

To replace ornaments, get permits, repair poles (that aren't ours) would cost into the thousands. The Beautification and Development Committee attempted to raise funds to replace the ornaments. They did receive a couple of thousand dollars in donations but that would not replace one ornament and pay for the repairs on the poles. In talking with one business owner, he has given permission to place a life-size nativity scene on his property. The B&D committee is in the process of purchasing one now but it will not be made and delivered in time for this Christmas season. If it is purchased now we have another problem and that will be storage. I will be talking to the company in the next week to see how much storage it will take. We may have to lease storage locally until more funds can be raised before storage building can be bought. Do any of you have any suggestions on how to get rid of the old decorations? I'd love to be able to sell them so we can use some of those funds for the above but we may have to be thankful if we find someone to come get them and take them off our hands! Let me know if you have any ideas.
