Response Rate Fun Facts

- Utah had the second highest cumulative Internet selfresponse rate at 58.9 percent, behind Minnesota
- Utah was second for all Western states with a cumulative total self-response rate of 63.7 percent
- Custer County, CO and Slope County, ND tied for highest daily total self-response at 0.2 percent each
- Los Alamos County, NM had the highest cumulative Internet self-response rate at 74.3 percent
- Los Alamos County, NM was the top west county by area with a self-response rate of 79.3 percent

Update: Census Bureau to Resume Some 2020 Census Field Operations in Additional Locations

In coordination with federal, state and local health officials, the Census will begin a phased restart of some field operations starting the week of May 25.
